Psalm 147.1-7

- 1 Praise the Lord! How good it is to sing praises to our God; for he is gracious, and a song of praise is fitting.
- 2 The Lord builds up Jerusalem; he gathers the outcasts of Israel.
- 3 He heals the broken-hearted, and binds up their wounds.



- 4 He determines the number of the stars; he gives to all of them their names.
- 5 Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure.
- 6 The Lord lifts up the downtrodden; he casts the wicked to the ground.
- 7 Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving; make melody to our God on the lyre.

A reading from the book of Isaiah (35.3-6)

Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees.

Say to those who are of a fearful heart,

"Be strong, do not fear!

Here is your God.

He will come with vengeance,

with terrible recompense.

He will come and save you."

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke (10.1-9)

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'

This is the gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, o Christ.

Reflection:

'N, God has called you by name and made you his own' Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit'.

These are the words with which the Bishop addresses Amber, Carol, Julie and Rick at their Confirmation this Sunday. They were said to all of us who were confirmed at some point in our lives:

'God had called you by name and made you his own.'

Let us take this occasion to reflect on the meaning of these words for us. In the Bible, we have many examples of people whom God has called by name: Abraham, Samuel, Ruth, Jeremiah, Isaiah, Mary, Joseph, Peter, James, Andrew, Matthew, Martha, Mary Magdalene, Paul, Priscilla, Phoebe, just to mention a few. God has called them by name and when they said 'yes, here I am,' their lives become part of God's work in the world. God did amazing things through them.

Do you ever think of yourself as someone who could be one of the people in the Bible—one of the women or men who crossed Jesus' path, to whom Jesus may have said 'can I come and eat at your house tonight' or 'will you come and follow me'? I am sure all of the first disciples, whose stories inspire us in the Bible, were wondering as we might 'why has Jesus called me'? And often people respond saying 'Lord, I am not worthy', 'how can it be me, Lord?' In Psalm 139 we read 'O Lord, you have searched me and known me, you know when I sit down and when I rise up; ...you search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways.' God knows us deep down, and most importantly, God knows us better than we know ourselves. God knows who we are and wants us to become who God made us to be. So, when God calls us by name, and we say 'yes, here I am' we are beginning to allow God to help us become most fully ourselves, to fulfil our destiny, which is to have a part in God's work in the kingdom. That's amazing! God knows me. God sees who I am. God deeply cares about me and calls me by name. God wants to make me his own.

But, I am not worthy, I am not good enough, I am scared, how can this be? No one is worthy! But we are all created by God, who thinks us worthy and calls us. We can trust that and marvel at it and realise that none of us is perfect or complete. We are invited to surrender and trust God. And, to accept that we are all on a journey invited to learn, to grow, to become the person God made us to be.

When we are baptised and confirmed we become Jesus' disciples—the word 'disciple' derives from latin and means 'learner'. Perhaps, one Sunday in Church we should all turn up with 'learner' plates on our fronts and backs, so none of us thinks we are complete or finished. Being a disciple, a learner with Jesus, means that we don't need to do it on our own. We are part of a community who are all learners—here to support each other and learn form each other. Each one of us will be able to think of people who have helped us on our way; who have encouraged us when we were overwhelmed by doubt and questions; who have taught and inspired us—by the way they live or something they have said. And, as disciples, learners with Jesus, we have Jesus by our side. I am writing this on the day when we remember Teresa of Avila in the church calendar. She wrote 'Jesus Christ seemed to be by my side continually, ...I had a most distinct feeling that He was always on my right hand, a witness of all I did; and never at any time, if I was but slightly recollected, or not too much distracted, could I be ignorant of His near presence'. (from Bouquet (ed.), A lectionary of Christian Prose, 1965, pp156,7) The same is true for us: Jesus is by our side continuously—through prayer and grace we learn to trust this. It means, as his disciples, we are never alone. What a gift. What a joy.

And finally, like the people God called in the Bible, we, too, are sent. To be labourers in God's harvest and to trust in God's presence with us, especially when life is challenging or the task in front of us seems too hard, or God calls us in unexpected ways. God, who has called us by name and made us his own, will give us all we need if we rely on him and let him be our strength and goal, and much more!

The prayer we say at the end of our church services: 'Wherever you go, God is sending you. Wherever you are, God has put you there. Christ who indwells you has something He wants to do with you where you are. Believe this, and go in His grace, love and power.' (Richard Halverson). **Amen.**
